

Sammamish Farmers Market's 2020 plan to protect against the Covid-19 and while under restrictions set forth by our government  
Market opens May 6 – September 16, Wednesdays, 4 – 8pm.

The Market board and staff continue to monitor the advancing COVID-19 health crisis closely, seeking guidance from our partners at King County Health and Environmental Services and the Washington State Farmers Market Association. Governor Inslee has specifically named Farmers Markets as part of essential businesses that can stay open during the current restrictions.

We believe the availability of local foods is key to a healthy community and that the market is an important platform for our farmers, processors and other small businesses to sell directly to that community. Our market has the advantage of being an open-air clean park at the City center with excellent airflow and on-site restroom facilities.

Precautions taken with Vendors, staff, volunteers and customers will include temperature testing with a no-touch thermometer before they are allowed to enter and participate. A telephone interview will be taken to ensure they have no symptoms. A chart will be kept weekly to monitor findings. All vendors are asked to wear a mask and gloves. The restaurant health dept. checks will continue as they always do each week and reported to the health dept. Their booths will have markings and signs to encourage the 6 foot physical distances needed to prevent any exposure. The booths will be set up to have the appropriate distance between them at at least 6 feet apart.

We will allow curbside pick-up with any advance orders.
